**RICHMOND, TEXAS—** The youth in Richmond and Rosenberg have another reason to celebrate the coming summer months away from school. The new Richmond-Rosenberg Club has the capacity to serve 350 children and teens on a daily basis and will provide programs and services Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. during the summer. The Club will also be open every day after school when school resumes in the fall. Boys & Girls Clubs' evidence-based programs center on academic achievement, high school graduation and career and college exploration, healthy lifestyles and physical fitness, character and leadership groups and community service projects. Registration is currently open for a \$20 flat membership fee.
